Educational need

- Emerging topics in EAHP Congresses
 - Effectiveness, appropriateness, accuracy, and objectives of pharmacotherapy
 - Drug related problems and/or readmissions
 - Interface of procurement, clinical pharmacy & patient safety
- Proposal by the Board and by the Scientific Committee
- Linked to European Statement on Hospital Pharmacy
 - 1.1, 1.4, 1.5 (multidisciplinarity, supervision of medicin use)
 - 2.2, 2.7 (leadership in medication review, policy for patient's own drugs)
 - 4.1 4.6 (therapeutic decision-making)
 - 5.2, 5.4 5.9 (several tasks related to patient safety and quality assurance)
- Harmonisation and unanimously approved structure

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

Education

- Are pharmacists trained and skilled to extract information from the patient's record to advise therapists who have a close clinical insight in the case? (e.g. hypokalaemia)
- What are the training needs at basic education, specialisation and continuing education levels for this kind of shared responsibility and leadership?



Excellence

- Pharmacology and biochemistry are presumably a pharmacist's skills, but is the his advice well perceived and appreciated by the highly specialised experienced physician / therapist?
- What additional information from laboratory data, TDM, pharmacokinetics, phenotyping / ...omics or further diagnostic tools does the hospital pharmacist need for the <u>personalised</u> medicines review?



Appropriateness

- Is the pharmacist skilled and qualified to assess the inappropriateness of a pharmacotherapy? (as compared to a "qualified person" in QA)
- Shouldn't he/she be participant in interdisciplinary ward rounds as opposed to pure pharmaceutical medicines review (e.g. nutrition support team)?
- Can a hospital's medicines selection contribute to limit inappropriate prescribing and drug related problems (e.g. medicines not metabolised by the intestinal nor hepatic CYP450 isoenzymes)?



Plenary Podium Discussion on further aspects and seamless medicines reconciliation

Quality Assurance

- Under which norms or guidelines can medication review be supervised?
- In terms of analysis (ICH guidelines), how is accuracy, precision, repeatability, reproducibility, and robutness of medication review validated? (supervision of the supervisor)
- Is medication review a pure (technical) issue and thus automatable (Clinical Decision Support System) or does it need a scientific (not-automatable) reasoning?



Harmonisation / Next steps

- How to respond to country-specifities?
- How to harmonise the achievements of advanced countries with emerging? (compared to the resolution on hospital manufacturing and preparation)
- Option: Stewardships Best Practices Risk Assessment?
- Long-term achievements and stabilisation?


