- aligned and efficient changes of medicine and treatments nationally across hospitals


KNOWLEDGE SHARING AND COORDINATION IS KEY TO SUCCESS

WHAT WAS DONE?

- The National Implementation Group was established in September 2019
- The purpose is to discuss, assess and ensure implementation of recommendations and treatment guidelines from the Danish Medicines Council (DMC) across regions
- The achivement is national consensus on aligned medical treatment

WHY WAS IT DONE?

- DMC provides guidance about new medicines for use in public hospitals, and recommendations from the DMC can lead to changes in medical treatments
- Preparatory processes are necessary and relevant stakeholders have to be involved before changes can be implemented
- Relevant stakeholders are e.g. drug and therapeutic committees, hospital pharmacies, clinicians, and the national supply organization
- Knowledge sharing and coordination among stakeholders are crucial to ensure efficient and nationally aligned implementation




HOW WAS IT DONE?

- The National Implementation Group is formed with representatives from all stakeholders with expertise in implementation of changes of medicines in hospitals
- The designated participants from each region are directly involved in the implementation

The national implementation process in

Denmark takes approximately 14 days

• The Group holds a monthly virtual meeting one week after DMC recommendations are published to ensure effective knowledge sharing and coordination



WHAT HAS BEEN ACHIEVED?

- The national implementation process takes approximately 14 days
- The recommendations from the DMC are regularly discussed, assessed, and implemented efficiently and aligned at national level
- Evaluation through focus group interviews show that the Group: - aligns implementation nationally - offers expertise
- saves regional resources
- fosters valued knowledge sharing concerning implementation of changes of medicine and adherence to recommendations
- The Group has now been successfully integrated as part of implementation at national level

WHAT NEXT?

- The Group will increase its focus on identifying differences in treatments based on enhanced utilization of health data
- The Group provides the basis for knowledge sharing and can easily be transferred to other healthcare settings, both nationally and internationally





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
